

10 Things to do with a Car

- Stonehenge is one of our most mystical sites and, approximately 30 miles away, within easy reach of Bath. It is believed that nearby Avebury's megalithic stones were the predecessor to Stonehenge, so you may wish to take a quick detour en route!
- 2. Highclere Castle near Newbury is approximately an hour's drive from the hotel. When you visit you will recognise many rooms from "Downton Abbey." In addition you can also find Tutankhamun in the cellars!
- 3. Longleat House and gardens are open all year. The Safari Park may close during the winter but it's still easy to spend a day here especially if you get lost in the world's largest hedge maze!
- 4. Castle Combe has to be one of the most picturesque villages in England. It was the location for the original filming of Dr Dolittle, and more recently Steven Spielberg's War Horse.
- 5. You may recognise Lacock Abbey from certain Hogwarts scenes in the Harry Potter films. It's not far from Castle Combe and is well worth a visit. Lacock village also offers a couple of nice lunch opportunities.

- Garden lovers will be delighted with Capability Brown's landscaping of Stourhead, featuring a Palladian Bridge. You could also visit Prince Charles' gardens at Highgrove.
- 8. Salisbury is close to Stonehenge, and its famous Cathedral has one of only four copies of King John's Magna Carta of 1215.
- 9. The Cotswolds are scattered with many picturesque villages. Allow a minimum of 4 to 5 hours for a round trip.

- Visit Bath Abbey. Adjacent to the Roman Baths, this 600-year-old site is steeped in history, and was the crowning place of King Edgar, England's first unified King, in 973AD. Climb the Bell Tower and you'll be rewarded with spectacular views over Bath.
- 3. The Holburne Museum and the Victoria Art Gallery have exciting exhibitions to delight any art enthusiast.
- Escape the gloomy weather with a visit to our award-winning Spa & Bath House; slip into the warm waters of the relaxation pool, warm up in the sauna, or perhaps treat yourself to one of the many excellent treatments on offer.
